## President's Report 2023 AGM

The past twelve months have enabled the Stuartholme Sacré Coeur Association (SSCA) to represent and connect with its members. The SSCA has worked hard over the past year to strengthen its strategic direction and ongoing commitment to celebrate and share the Gift of Stuartholme and a Sacred Heart Education.

The SSCA organised and ran the third biannual Alumnae Art Show "*Exposition des Beaux Arts*" in October 2022 which raised over \$49,000 in funds to support young women to have the opportunity to receive the Gift of a Sacred Heart Education. The SSCA would like to acknowledge and thank the art show committee members who volunteered many hours towards the preparation, planning and running of *Exposition des Beaux Arts 2022*: Angelique Tracey (Art Show Chairperson), Bonnie Masters, Adelaide McDonald, Kristen Mountjoy, Naomi Herron, Marg O'Sullivan, Bess Howard, Georgina Woods, Lizzie Woods, Terri Herps and Ellie Foxcroft. The SSCA also acknowledge the support from the Stuartholme Art Department and Community Engagement Manager.

The revised SSCA Constitution was implemented following its adoption at the 2022 AGM. The updated Constitution provides a current reference and complies with requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC.)

The SSCA have been working closely with stakeholders including Stuartholme School, to establish the Stuartholme Sacré Coeur Endowment Fund through the Brisbane Catholic Archdiocesan Fund. At first instance, SSCA has committed \$200,000 (transferred 26/05/2023) from SSCA cash reserves towards establishment of 'The Fund.' This initiative provides a long term financial foundation for the SSCA and the opportunity to engage a larger donation base (with tax-deductibility status) and funding commitments such as Stuartholme School bursaries. Part of the review process included a review and restructure of the SSCA Alumnae Bursary (name yet to be formalised) which will now fund one third of tuition fees for a successful applicant during Grade 10 -12 (inclusive.)

The SSCA played an integral role in the Stuartholme School Inaugural Giving Day on 14 September 2022. A one-off \$50,000 matched donation from the SSCA cash reserves was pledged towards the 2022 Giving Day.

The SSCA was also involved in a range of events that enabled connection with alumnae, the current Stuartholme School community and wider networks.

The SSCA hosted the third annual International Women's Day Breakfast in March 2023 with alumna Guest Speaker Megan Quinn (Class of 1981.) This event continues to grow in attendance each year and provides a great opportunity for alumnae and the general community to connect and engage with Stuartholme.

The 2023 recipient of the Stuartholme School Erskine Alumnae Recognition Award -Outstanding Alumna of the Year was awarded to Anna-Louise Kassulke (Class of 1982.) This is a significant award within the Stuartholme alumnae and current Stuartholme School community. It acknowledges the Gift of a Sacred Heart Education and exceptional success in the recipient's chosen professional/industry and contribution to the community.
